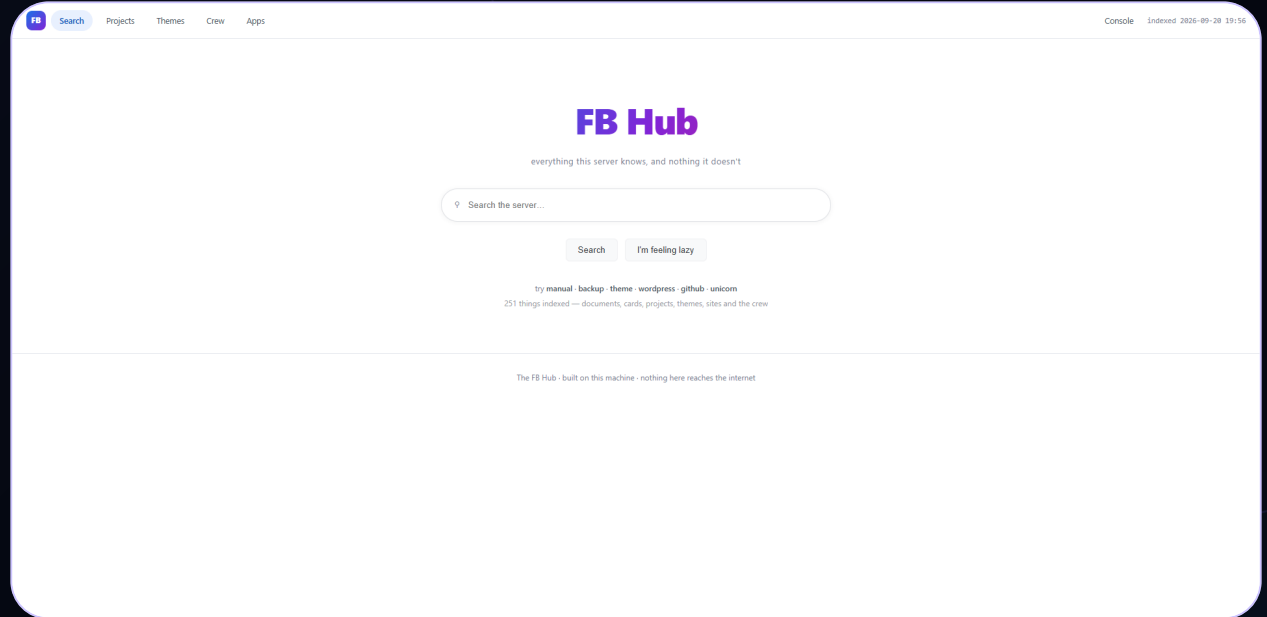

The Hub promises two things at once: it can find what the server has written down, and it will not invent what the server does not know.



ONE · THE PROMISE

A familiar search shape, with a very strict boundary.

The Hub places one search box over the server's own written knowledge: documents, board cards, projects, the design library, sites and the crew. It does not reach the web and it does not call an outside service.

“Nothing on this server matches that. **That is an answer too.**”

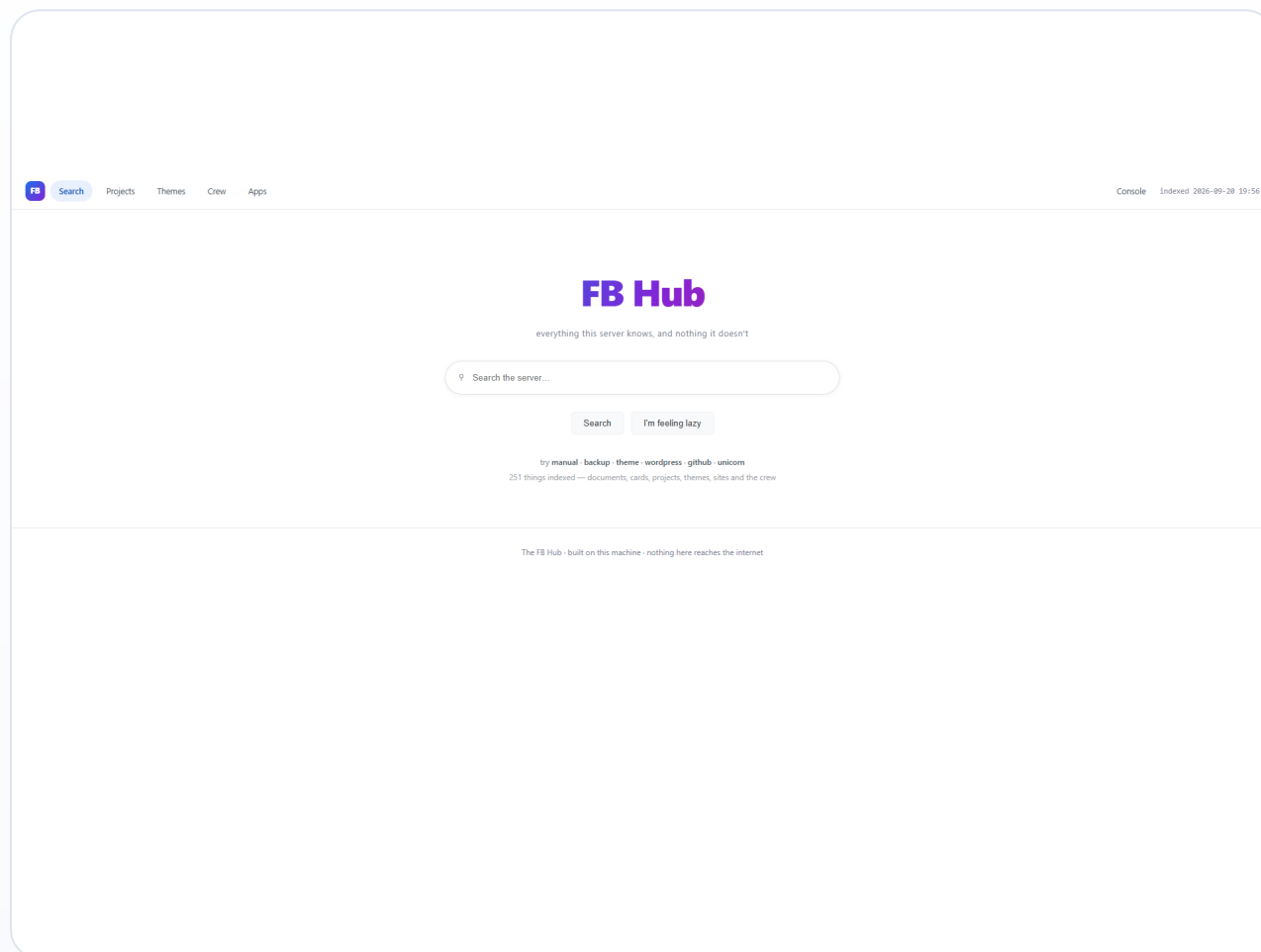

SEARCH HOME · 251 THINGS INDEXED

TWO · SEPARATION BY DESIGN

Index once. Search instantly.

The Hub is split into three pieces: an indexer that walks recognised parts of the machine, a timer that rebuilds the index every five minutes, and a browser page that searches the already-built file. The page itself holds no machine powers.

01 · SOURCE

Server content

Cards, documents, themes, agents, projects and sites already written on this machine.



02 · INDEXER

Walk + recognise

Reads known locations and writes title, snippet, owner and modified time into one prepared list.



03 · TIMER

Every 5 minutes

Keeps the prepared list close to the current state without searching the whole machine on each query.



04 · PAGE

Browser-side search

Searches the prepared list immediately. Fast because it does not scan the machine while you wait.

INVISIBLE RACE BUG, FIXED

The indexer originally used one fixed temporary filename. A manual rebuild and the five-minute timer could overlap and collide. Temporary files now include the process number, so two runs cannot rename the same working file out from under each other.

The important lesson is not the filename. It is that overlapping background work needs its own working space.

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WHAT THE COUNT IS TELLING YOU

As more work gets written down, more becomes findable. The useful signal is not only what search finds; it is also what repeatedly comes back empty.

A category can exist and honestly show zero. The Hub does not hide unfinished parts to make the system look more complete than it is.

Zero sites is information. It tells you the library is ready before a real site has been produced from it.

- findable work
- visible gaps
- no invented answers



FOUR · THE QUIET SAFETY LAYER

It marks. It does not censor.

While the indexer reads each item, it also looks for material that should trigger a review before anything leaves the machine. A flagged result remains fully visible to the owner; the warning travels with the item.

NETWORK ADDRESS

Looks for address patterns while excluding deliberately harmless examples and loopback addresses.

HARDWARE ADDRESS

Marks unique network identifiers that could identify a device.

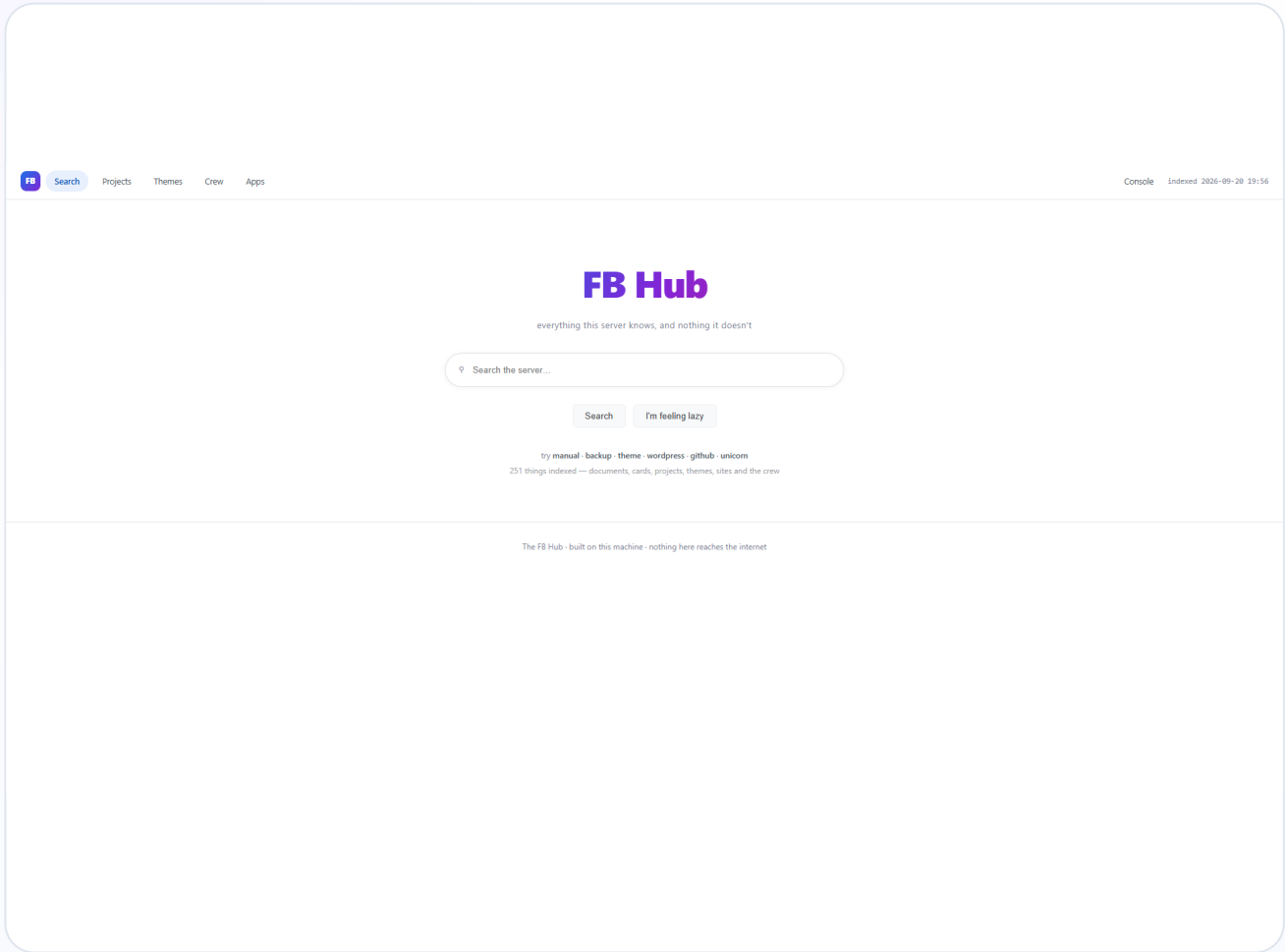
SECRET-ASSOCIATED WORDS

Marks vocabulary such as key, passphrase or wireless-network naming language. A match is not a claim that a secret was found.

A warning is the start of a decision, not the end of one. The scan deliberately prefers a false positive over silently missing something that should not be published.



REVIEW BEFORE RELEASE · HUMAN DECISION REMAINS IN THE LOOP



LITERAL WORD SEARCH · RESULTS ARE SCORED IN THE BROWSER

FIVE · THE FIRST TAB

Type the words the machine would use.

The Hub does literal word matching. A match in a title carries more weight than a match elsewhere, and results are listed best first with the matching words highlighted.

SCORING

title	word in the title = 5 points
anywhere	word elsewhere = 2 points
result	anything above zero can appear

WHEN NOTHING MATCHES

The page says so plainly and offers to show the command for creating a card. It does not create the card itself, because a card needs an owner.

“I'm feeling lazy” is intentionally small: it chooses one of five interesting search words at random. It is a shortcut, not a tour.

SIX · WORK WITH A WRITTEN FINISH

Projects keep the forecast beside the fact.

Each project shows what it is for, who leads it, who is on the team and four dates side by side.

INSIDE A PROJECT

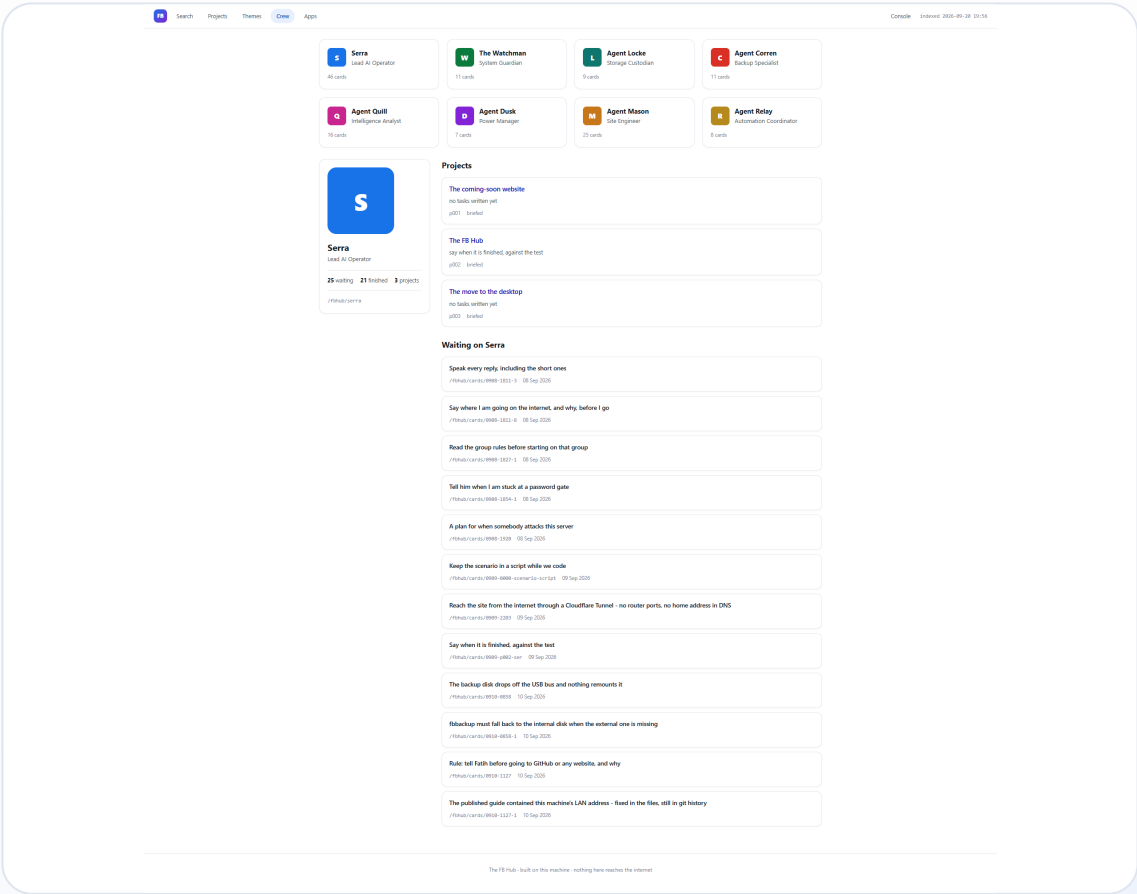
- Overview** - purpose and written finish test.
- Team & tasks** - each member's real state and self-written tasks.
- Notes** - a running log.
- Brief** - commands that ask the crew where they are and speak the answers.

Project notes are validated by the server before one line is appended: project name, known author, length under 2,000 characters and no control characters.

EIGHT · OWNERSHIP MADE VISIBLE

The person is a view over the work.

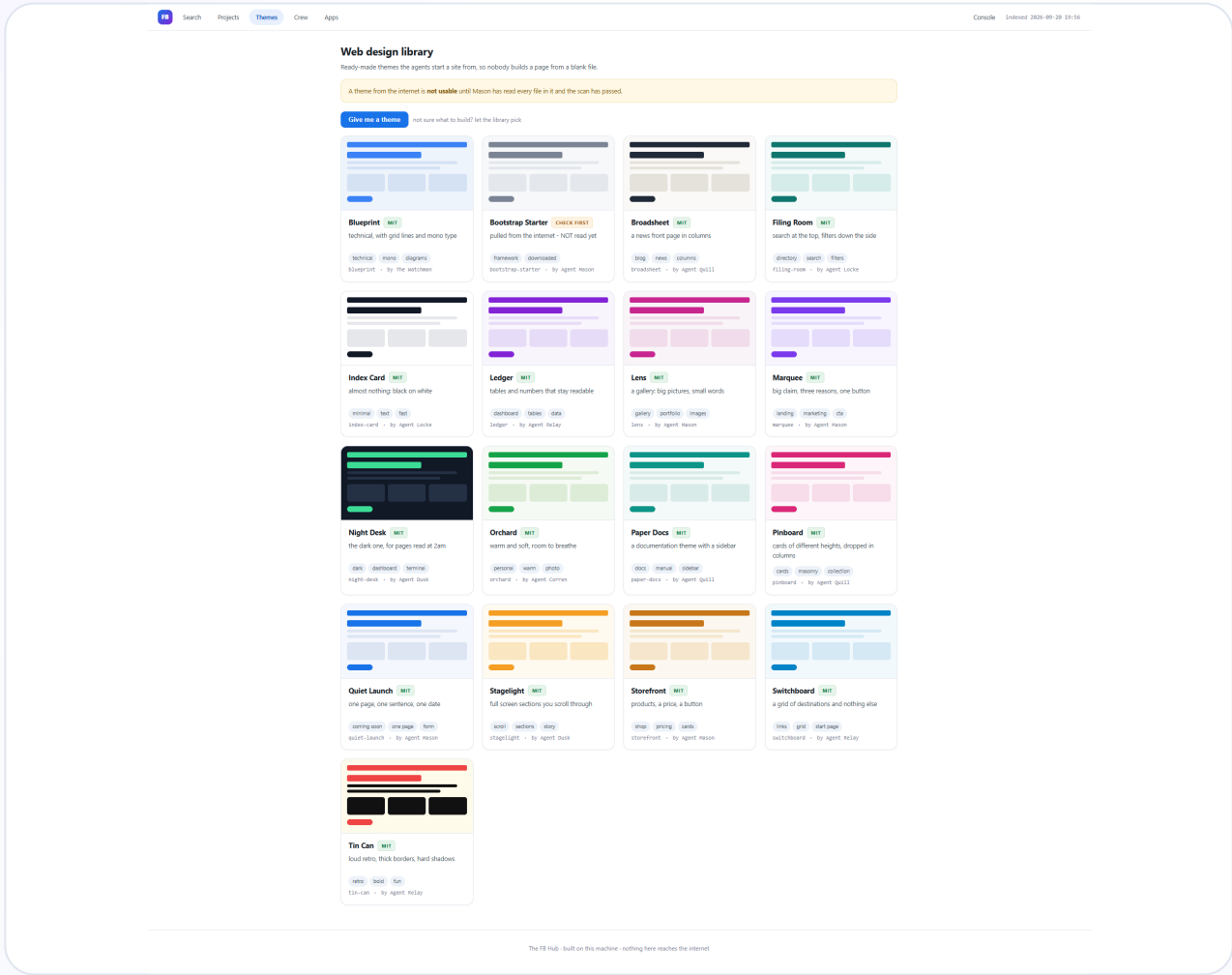

The crew page is assembled from the board when the index is built. Nobody maintains a second copy of what each agent owns.

SEVEN · WEB DESIGN LIBRARY

A clean starting point for every site.

Each theme is a small complete HTML/CSS website written on this machine. The tile shows a miniature, its licence, one-line purpose and tags.

COPY, DON'T EDIT THE LIBRARY

fbhub theme get <theme> --for <agent> --site <name>

The tool copies the theme into the agent's own site folder. The shared library remains clean for the next person.

CHECK FIRST MEANS REFUSAL

A theme that arrived from outside the machine is not usable until every file has been read and the scan has passed. The rule is enforced, not merely displayed.

Being present in the library is not the same as being approved.

WHY THIS LIST CAN STAY HONEST

Every description is read from the tool's own help text rather than maintained by hand. If a tool changes, the Hub can reflect the tool instead of slowly drifting into old documentation.

21 of 59 tools are documented here. The missing 38 are not hidden by pretending the set is complete; the gap is already recorded as work.

THE PAGE ASKS • THE SERVER DECIDES

Record something without making the page powerful.

The Notes tab is the Hub's small controlled exception to a mostly read-only design. The web page itself cannot write to shared work areas.

1 • User enters note

project, crew author, short text

**2 • Server validates**

known project, known author,
under 2,000 chars, no control
characters

**3 • Append one line**

written in the server's own
safe location

WHAT WAS NOT DONE

The shared area was not made globally writable just to make the feature convenient. The page requests the action; the server owns the decision and the write.

This is the same design principle that runs through FB Server: a useful interface does not need broad power if the privileged boundary is narrow and explicit.

TEN · KEYBOARD

Fast enough to become habit.

/ · SEARCH

Jump to the search box from anywhere unless you are already typing.

ESCAPE · ONE STEP BACK

Closes an overlay first; otherwise returns to the page you came from, remembering up to forty steps. On the search home page it deliberately does nothing.

A predictable back key matters because people stop using navigation they do not trust.

ELEVEN · HONEST LIMITS

The Hub says where its edge is.

Words, not meaning

synonyms do not find each other automatically

Snippets, not full files

the index holds an opening extract to stay fast

Up to 5 minutes behind

new material waits for the next rebuild

One machine only

it knows nothing outside the server by design
